Need to get a Commercial Pesticide Applicators License?

To apply pesticides on a commercial basis, applicators must be licensed by the Colorado Department of Agriculture (CDA). CNGA and CSU are offering a series of four classes Friday, March 3, 10, 17, and 24, 2006 from 9 a.m.—3 p.m. to help you attain this license.

A general exam and multiple exams for certain crop categories, administered by CDA, must be passed with a score of 70 percent or better to obtain a license. These exams are tough. Those who don't go in prepared, usually end up taking the test again.

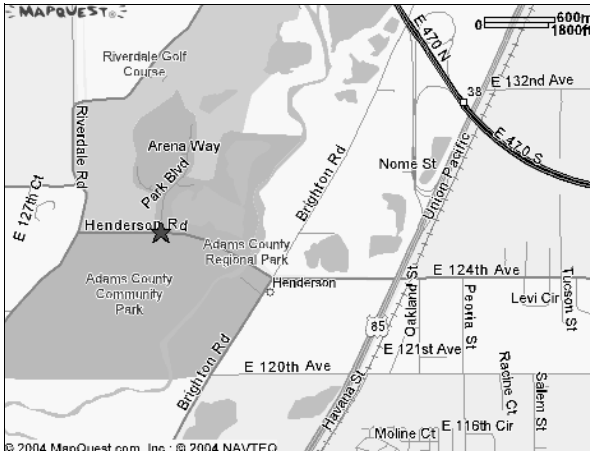
DIRECTIONS:
